

There are 5 different levels you can attempt:

LEVEL 3 adds some more notes in to make the song sound more sophisticated.


LEVEL 4 is very complex, but sounds pretty cool and has some great ideas for you to use in other songs too.



Your play-along track actually has the song 5 times: the first time is very slow and includes the melody being played just like you should play it. At the 2:00 mark, it's a little bit faster. At 4:00, even faster. Skip to the 6:00 mark and you'll hear the same fast track without the melody so you can perform for your family and friends. Finally, at the 8:00 mark, it's in key that is suggested in track 5, so you can try the song in that key as well!











Here are all the notes you'll need for the chords listed in the song:



- All 17 species of penguins are naturally found exclusively in the Southern Hemisphere.

Emperor Penguins are the tallest species, standing nearly 4 feet tall. The smallest is the Little Blue Penguin, which is only about 16 inches.

The fastest species is the Gentoo Penguin, which can reach swimming speeds up to 22 mph.

Penguins ingest a lot of seawater while hunting for fish, but a special gland behind their eyes—the supraorbital gland—filters out the saltwater from their blood stream. Penguins excrete it through their beaks, or by sneezing.

Unlike most birds—which lose and replace a few feathers at a time penguins molt all at once, spending two or three weeks land-bound as they undergo what is called the catastrophic molt.

If a female Emperor Penguin's baby dies, she will often "kidnap" an unrelated chick—but rather than raise it as her own, she soon abandons the stolen chick.

Because they aren't used to danger from animals on solid ground, wild penguins exhibit no particular fear of human tourists.

April 25 of each year is World Penguin Day

While they can't fly through the air with their flippers, many penguin species take to the air when they leap from the water onto the ice. Just before taking flight, they release air bubbles from their feathers. This cuts the drag on their bodies, allowing them to double or triple their swimming speed quickly and launch into the air.

Penguins are carnivores: they feed on fish, squid, crabs, krill and other seafood they catch while swimming. During the summer, an active, medium-sized penguin will eat about 2 pounds of food each day, but in the winter they'll eat just a third of that.

The Galapagos Penguin is the only penguin specie that ventures north of the equator in the wild.

No penguins live at the North Pole.

Penguins spend around half their time in water and the other half on land.

Emperor Penguins can stay underwater for around 20 minutes at a time.
